And can bring together the insights of scholars from all over the world and their suggestions to reduce the negative impact of the transformation process on society and to protect and cultivate future human resources."

The report of the cooperation project was titled "Working Transformation in the Asia-Pacific Region in the 21st Century", focusing on the challenges facing the Asia-Pacific region and proposing policy recommendations like higher education institutions, governments and industry leaders.

Professor Tan Jiayin said that although the emergence of AI will be the unemployment of some people, it will also create other new occupations.
