On the morning of November 7, the 7th APRU Research Symposium on Ageing in the Asia-Pacific was officially opened at the Zhongguanyuan Global Village, Peking University.

The theme of symposium was "Aging, Innovation and Sustainable Development" which included four parts: Main forum, theme conference, doctoral forum and organization visiting.

Youth Academic Training

In the doctoral forum on the morning of November 8, Professor Lu Bei from the University of New South Wales gave young scholars a training of their early academic career. She first introduced the CEPAR project at the University of New South Wales' Institute for Ageing and encouraged young students to apply for it. Then, she combined data and graphs to summarize the urgency of global ageing, especially the problem in China. She generated expectations to students who are aspiring to make contribution to the problem of ageing.


