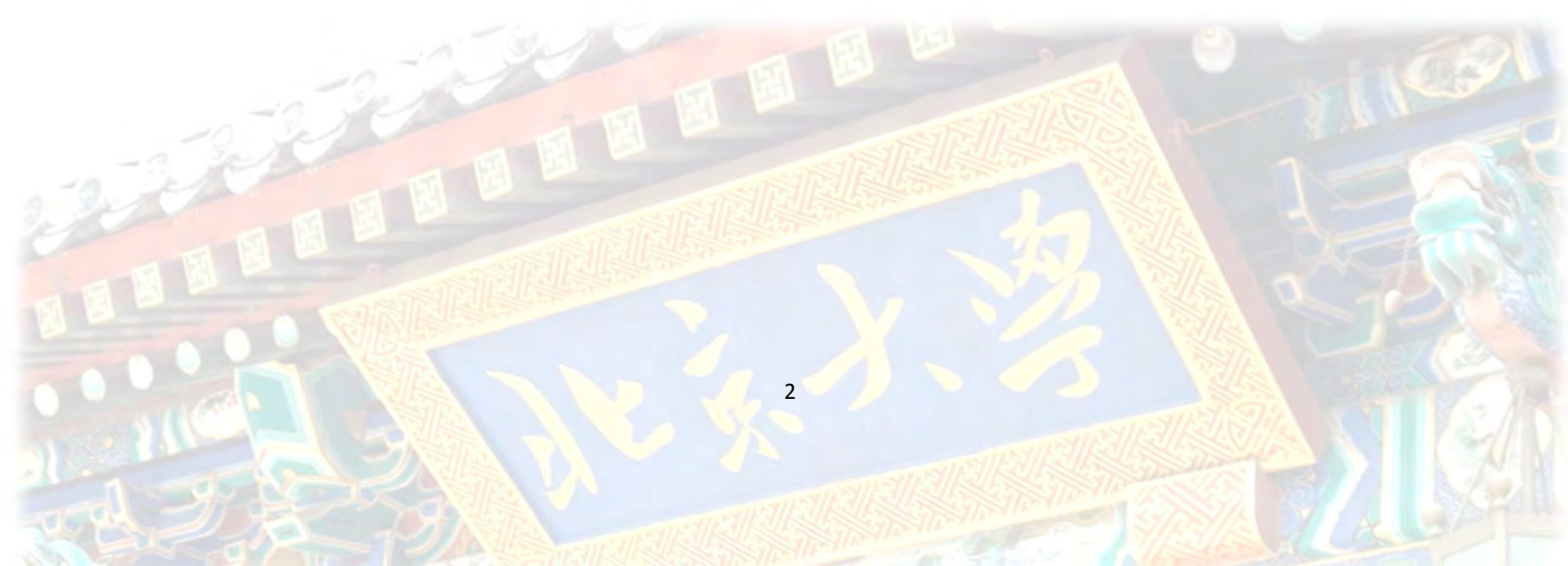

TO GUEST

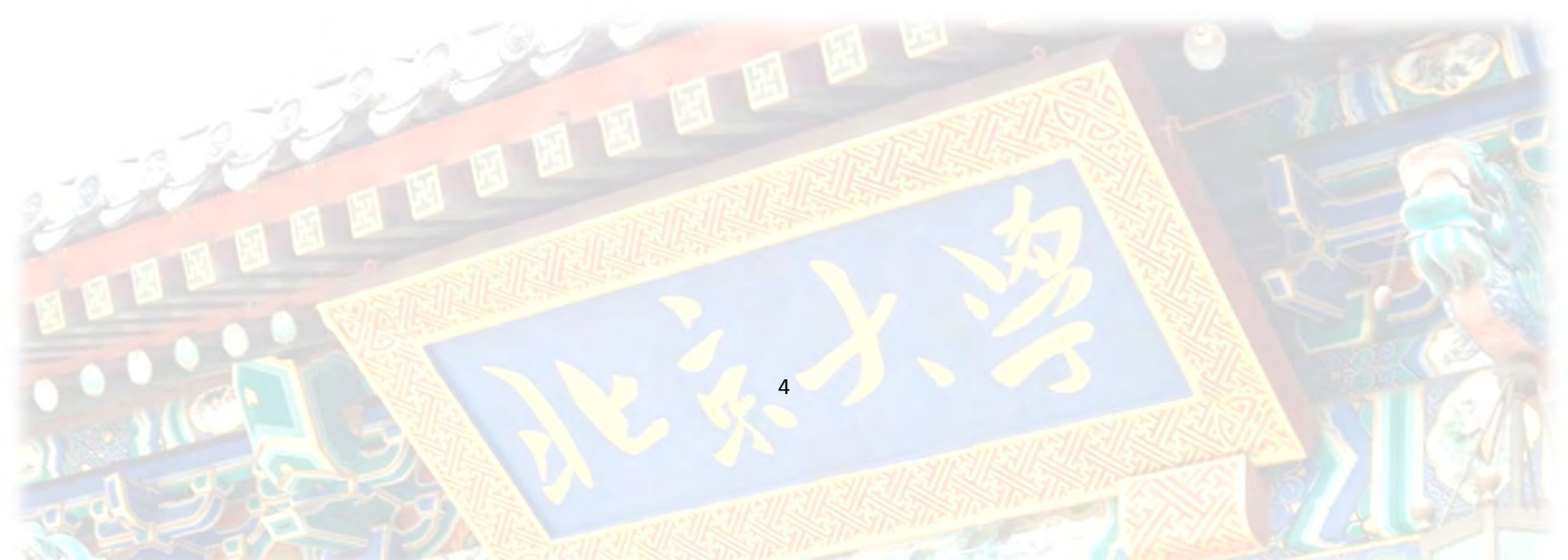

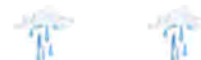

Beijing has a recorded history of over 3000 years and it is developing prosperously. Evidence of human ancestry dating back to 700,000 years ago has been found in such places as Zhoukoudian in the southwest part of Beijing, where the remains known as “Peking Man” were found.

Through the years’ development, Beijing has become an international cosmopolitan. It is governed as a direct-controlled municipality under the national government, with 16 urban and suburban districts.



Nowadays, Beijing is the second largest Chinese city by urban population after Shanghai and is the nation’s political, cultural and educational center. It is home to the headquarters of most of China’s largest state-owned companies, and is a major hub for the national highway, expressway, railway and high-speed rail networks. Beijing Capital International Airport is the second busiest airport in the world.

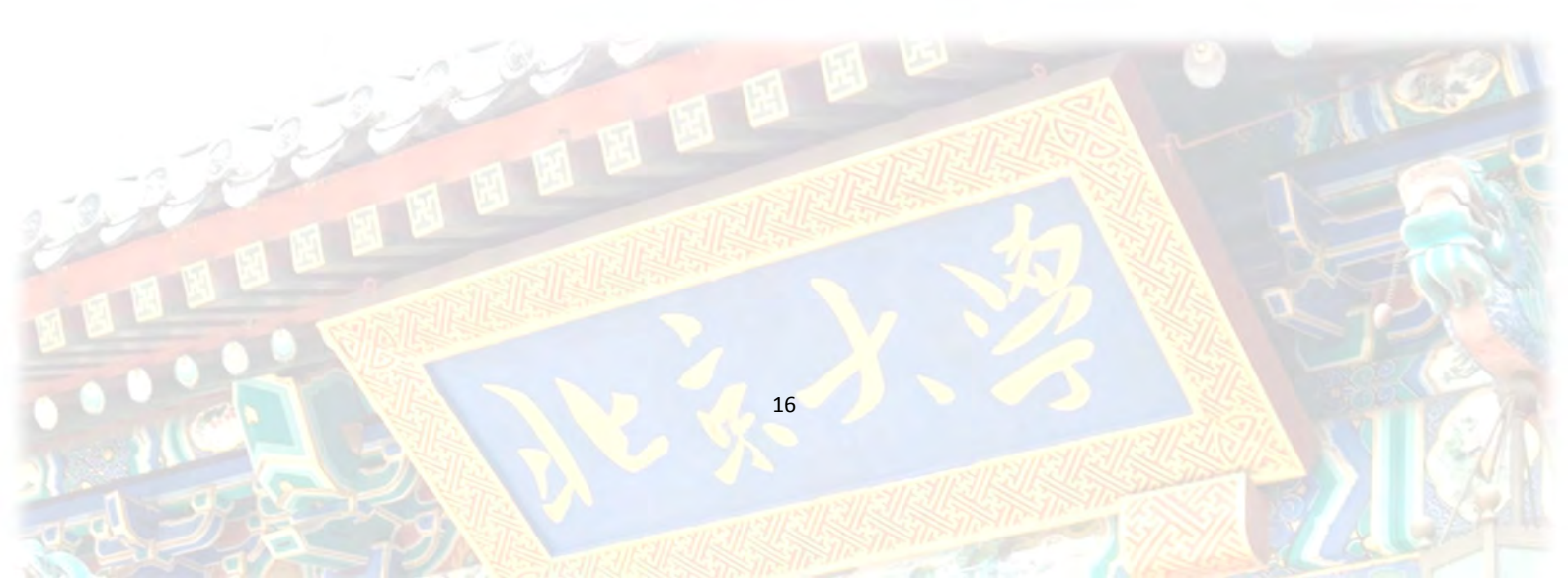

Airport to Zhongguanyuan Global Village Building 1

Zhongguanyuan Global Village Hotel Address: 126 Zhongguancun North Main Street
(in Pinyin: Zhongguan Cun Bei Dajie; in Chinese: 中关村北大街 126 号)

Airport to Hotel:

1. Taxi or Uber (cost about RMB 110 Yuan, takes about 40 minutes)

- 1) Waiting for the Taxis at the airport directly, the price is between 100-140 Yuan (including road tolls).
- 2) Using the taxi-hailing apps (like Uber), the price is between 120-140 Yuan (not including road tolls).

2. Metro (cost about RMB 30 Yuan, takes about 1 hour)

You can take Airport Line in Capital Airport Terminal 2, Terminal 3, and transfer to Metro Line 10 at Sanyuanqiao Station, and then transfer to Metro Line 4 at Hai Dian Huang Zhuang Station.

Getting off at East Gate of Peking University Station (D exit (Southwest), and then walking to the South about 322meters.

Railway Station to Zhongguanyuan Global Village Building1

From Beijing South Railway Station:

Take Metro Line 4 and get off at East Gate of Peking University Station D exit (Southwest)

From Beijing West Railway Station:

Take Metro Line 9 and transfer to Metro Line 4 at National Library Station, then get off at East Gate of Peking University Station D exit (Southwest)

From Beijing Station:

Take Metro Line 1 and transfer to Metro Line 4 at Xizhimen Station, then get off at East Gate of Peking University Station D exit (Southwest)

From Beijing North Railway Station:

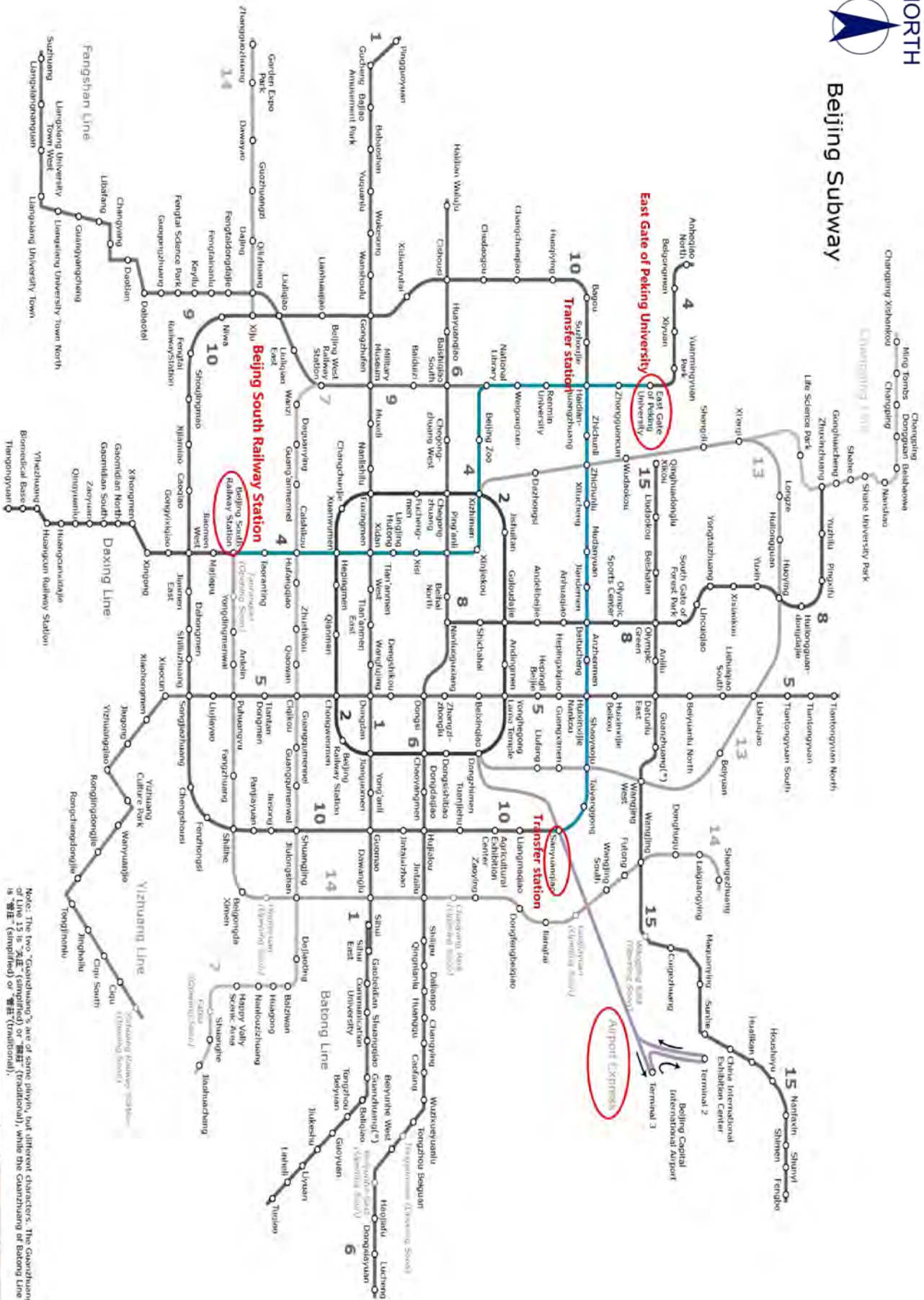

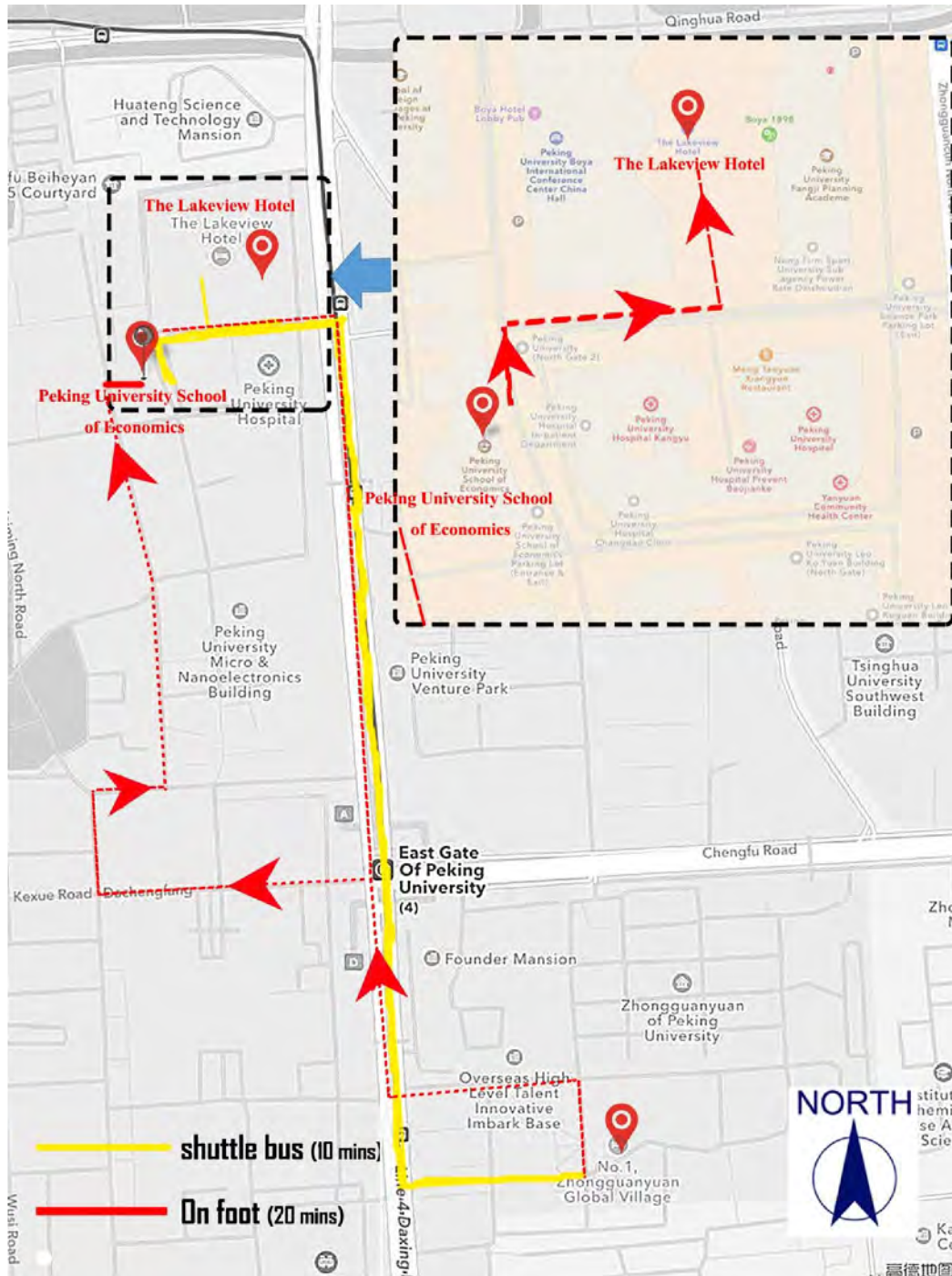


Beijing Subway
